- Promote ways for all Committees to relate to and interact.
- Capitalise on the efforts of UDIA NSW membership to strengthen the Institute's overall impact and awareness in NSW.

Committee Member Code

UDIA NSW Committee membership is a privilege desired by many members and the value of the Committee experience is determined by the quality and participation of its members. Committees provide expert insight to better the industry and UDIA's policies in NSW. Committees also offer a platform of networking with the most respected industry professionals. Each Committee member is expected to be a committed participant.

Responsibilities

3. Respect the Chair and Vice Chair decisions and directions.
4. Everything discussed within a Committee is for the benefit of the Committee and where needed confidential material and ideas need to be kept in confidence by all Committee members. Dialogue between Committees is to be in partnership with Chairs or as delegated by Chairs.
5. Work collaboratively with other members, Committees are for the benefit of the industry not individual businesses or persons.

6. Committee meeting attendance is paramount to growing industry intelligence and Committee results are reported to Council annually. Participate openly and honestly with specific, detailed information and experience.
7. The key to truly valuable interaction between the Committee members is the sharing of real ideas and real numbers, as well as successes and lessons learned.
